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Companion Animal Evacuation and Sheltering Public Information Materials

In accordance with Task 6 of the Companion Animal Evacuation and Sheltering Plan project, model public information messages that may be tailored to the individual jurisdictions were developed. These messages span all four areas of emergency management — mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

The contents of this public information packet include:

Response

- An informational <u>flyer</u> to disperse during the mobilization phase before an impending disaster.
- A sample print <u>press release</u> message intended to be used during the mobilization phase before an impending disaster.
- A sample audio script <u>press release</u> message during the mobilization phase before an impending disaster.
- An informational <u>flyer</u> to disperse post-disaster.
- A sample print press release message intended to be used post-disaster.
- A sample audio script press release message post-disaster.

Recovery

- A sample print press release message.
- A sample audio script <u>press release</u> message.

Mitigation/Preparedness

• A <u>brochure</u> to educate the public on how to prepare themselves and their pets for evacuation and sheltering.

If you become separated from your pet, please contact the [local Animal Control]; you will be expected to describe what your pet looks like. If you find that your pet was brought to an emergency animal shelter, you should bring a photo for positive identification to retrieve your pet.

HOMELESS PETS What to Do If You Find an Abandoned Pet

[Your City, State] (Date) - Pet owners may have either left their pets behind or become separated from their pets during the evacuation from [type of emergency]. If you find an abandoned pet, Animal Control advises that you call them immediately and do not attempt to capture the animal yourself. In times of distress, animals may become fearful and display acts of aggression towards strangers. To avoid injury and the possible spread of disease, do not touch the animal and call Animal Control as soon as possible.

If you become separated from your pet, please contact the [local Animal Control]; you will be expected to describe what your pet looks like. If you find that your pet was brought to an emergency animal shelter, you should bring a photo for positive identification to retrieve your pet.

HOMELESS PETS What to Do If You Find an Abandoned Pet

[Your City, State] (Date) – One of the most upsetting outcomes of [type of emergency] is the separation of pets from their owners – both for the pets and the owners.

If you find an abandoned pet, do not attempt to capture the animal yourself. In times of distress, animals may become fearful and display acts of aggression towards strangers. To avoid injury and the possible spread of disease, do not touch the animal. Call Animal Control immediately.

If you become separated from your pet, please contact the [local Animal Control]; you will be expected to describe what your pet looks like. If you find that your pet was brought to an emergency animal shelter, you should bring a photo for positive identification to retrieve your pet.
